FENCING* Grades 2-6

They are also challenged to learn French and Italian terminology embedded in this classical sport. With Team Touché, campers will glean knowledge and techniques from a group of coaches boasting many years of experience and a bevy of swashbuckling high-seas tales. Campers pursue whole-body fitness while partaking in engaging activities.

HORSEBACK RIDING* Grades 3-7

All aspects of horsemanship and sportsmanship are taught in the fun and safe environment at Rockin' L&D Ranch. Not only will your campers get on a horse every day, they will also learn everything that goes into taking care of a horse! Your campers will learn all about Horsemanship: the "total package", an overall understanding of horses, Horse Behavior, Horse Grooming, Leading Horses, Tacking-Up, Western Dressage, traditional Westering Riding Skills, Ranch Skills: Goat tying, weighing feed, and horses, horse bathing, cleaning stalls and saddles, and barrel vaulting. Rockin' L&D Ranch follows the high standards and protocols of the Certified Horsemanship Association. On the last day, campers participate in a horse show and skill demonstration where a photographer will capture all of your camper's skills! Mid-afternoon Showcase on Friday.

Bus Transportation Grades K-11

Extended Care

From Hammers to Hoops: LIFELONG PASSIONS MEET NEW GENERATIONS AT CAMP JAYCEE

t Camp Jaycee, something special is happening. Skills honed over lifetimes are being passed down to young campers in dynamic and heartfelt ways, thanks to retired JCC members who have found new ways to give back.

A Woodworking Vision takes Root

It all began when Phil Ginsburg, former JCC Board President, casually mentioned his love for tools during a chat with Camp Jaycee Director Sandy Siperstein-Rafner. He had no idea this conversation would spark a new chapter of involvement with the JCC—a place he's championed for decades. Inspired, Phil brought in his lifelong friends and talented woodworkers, Paul Treger and Howard Dworkin, to help provide a woodworking workshop for campers. The trio, friends for over 50 years, decided on birdhouse kits as a simple, hands-on project for the campers.

"We wanted to introduce tools to the kids," Phil explains, "and Sandy found someone to donate the funds for 30 sets of tools. Wow!"

Over two two-hour sessions, the three longtime friends guided campers through assembling the kits. Phil noted, "The enthusiasm for the project blew me away." Paul concurred, "I was surprised how every child was so actively engaged and happy with what they were doing."

Lifelong Friends Build Confidence

Howard shared Phil's sense of fulfillment. "The kids were naturals," he said. "I thought I'd have to walk them through every step, but they surprised me. Most of them figured it out intuitively, and it was amazing to see their confidence grow."

Paul added, "It was very gratifying to see the kids engaged and becoming proficient with tools that they were unfamiliar with, ending up with a project that they could be proud of and take home, and knowing how to do all of this safely."

Full-Court Connections

Later in the summer, Phil ran into fellow retired attorney, and JCC member, Wayne Schwartz. Their conversation led to Wayne chatting about the topic with Sandy, where he half-joked that it was a shame he didn't have any useful skills like woodworking. That quip prompted her to suggest he share his passion for basketball.

"I've been playing ball at the J since it opened, so this felt like a natural fit," Wayne said. With Sandy's encouragement, he planned a 90-minute clinic for 20 campers that blended drills, races, and plenty of smiles and laughter.

Wayne also appreciated the importance of sharing the values of the game he loves. "I think it's invaluable. Basketball teaches teamwork, coordination, athleticism, and competitiveness—within reason," he posited.

Reflecting on his experience, Wayne shared how much the clinic meant to him personally. "It just puts you back to your youth. It's like a flashback, and when you see that unbridled enthusiasm, it's a full-circle kind of experience. It adds quality to your life and allows you to express yourself in ways you probably don't typically do in retirement."

Camp Magic Spans Generations

From tools to teamwork, Camp Jaycee is creating opportunities for generations to connect in meaningful ways. For Phil, Paul, Howard, and Wayne, the rewards go far beyond the workshops and clinics, reminding everyone involved that it's never too late—or too early—to share a passion.
